5 Star Chapter President's Message By Rufus Hoefer

On Sunday, 27 April 2014, we will celebrate our chapter's 40th anniversary! MOAA President and CEO, Vice Admiral Norb Ryan, will be the guest speaker and we will have a 50/50 raffle! Please see the article on page 3 and the reservation on page 5.

Do you ever ask yourself, "What's MOAA done for me lately?" Well, on 15 FEB 2014, S.25 was signed into law and it is now Public Law 113-82. It repealed certain provisions of the Bipartisan Budget Act, namely the annual one percent reduction in COLA raises for all military retirees under age 62 and everyone who entered active duty prior to 1 JAN 2014. However, it did not repeal the reduction for those who entered active duty after that date.

This is a vivid example of what MOAA has done for us lately. Here are some remarks on this subject provided by our upcoming speaker, **Vice Admiral Norb Ryan**, **USN (Ret.):**

"As you are aware MOAA, with huge support from their Council and Chapter networks, led the charge in Congress' recent relief of the latest harmful cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) cuts. The MOAA legislative team along with your Council & Chapter Network worked tirelessly and our members sent over 295,000 messages urging Congress to do the right thing. We spoke. They listened, but the battle is far from over.

"It was an important victory, saving working-age retirees tens of thousands in earned lifetime benefits. But, critical military benefits remain in jeopardy. The FY2015 defense budget is full of proposals to cut pay and benefits and shift costs to service members, retirees and military families. The proposals impact every segment of the military and retiree population, and include a military pay cap below the private sector for the second consecutive year, a change to the basic allowance for housing where service members will pay outof-pocket for their housing costs. A significant reduction to domestic commissary savings for uniformed personnel to the tune of 66% and the elimination of the managed health care option (TRICARE PRIME) for retires and active duty family members."

• Food bank: \$\$ and food (prefer money)



As noted in the President's Piece on page 1, our guest speaker will be Vice Admiral Norbert Ryan, USN (Ret.). He is the President and CEO of MOAA, and we are very privileged to have him. We most strongly encourage you to join us for this milestone event which will also include the Rogers High School JROTC Unit, who will present the colors and perform their "Fallen Comrades" remembrance.

Vice Admiral Ryan is a 1967 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy. One of the little known facts about him is that his identical twin brother, John, is also a 1967 USNA graduate and a retired Vice Admiral. Imagine being their proud parents! VADM Norb Ryan has served in his current position since September 2002. Prior to taking the helm at MOAA,

he spent 35 years on active duty serving as a naval aviator and P-3 pilot, Commanding Officer of Patrol Squadron 5 (VP-5), Commander of Patrol Wing Two, Commander of Patrol Wings U.S. Pacific Fleet, and Commander of Task Force Twenty. He was also the Navy's Chief of Legislative Affairs and Chief of Naval Personnel, so now we know why he's done so well at MOAA!

He was named 2010 Association Executive of the Year by Association TRENDS, a national trade publication. He is the first military officer to win this award in its 32-year history. Under Admiral Ryan's leadership, MOAA has been named a "Top Lobbyist" by *The Hill* newspaper for the past six years, and the only military service organization so listed for the last three years. Please do come and meet VADM Ryan, and see for yourself what an outstanding and gracious leader we are privileged to have. He will be accompanied by his lovely wife, Judy.

We have also invited other military officers from the local area and nearby chapters, as well as those who comprise the Washington State Council of Chapters (WSCOC) which is having their Spring meeting at the Mirabeau Park Hotel the preceding day.

LCDR David Melges, USN (Ret.) Chapter Secretary



After growing up in southern Minnesota, Dave joined the Navy in 1969 and then attended Fire Control A & C schools in Mare Island, California. He served on USS COCHRANE DDG21 from 1971-1982, attaining the rank of Senior Chief prior to receiving his commission as an Electronics Limited Duty Officer. He then joined the pre-commissioning crew of USS UNDERWOOD FFG36 in Bath, Maine, serving as

Electronics Readiness and Ordnance Officer while attaining his Surface Warfare Qualification and serving as a fleet Officer of the Deck.

In 1987 his first shore duty was as an initial member of the AEGIS Combat Systems Center, Wallops Island, Virginia. He performed many duties there including Scheduling Officer, Maintenance Officer and Combat Systems Officer. In 1989 LT Melges joined the crew of USS LEYTE GULF CG55 as Electronics Material Officer, and during the first Iraq war he served as the Anti-Air Warfare Coordinator in the USS ROOSEVELT CVN70 battle group. His last shore assignment was Enlisted Training Officer at the AEGIS Training Center, Dahlgren, Virginia, from 1994-1996. His final assignment was Combat Systems Officer onboard the USS ABRAHAM LINCOLN CVN72, retiring in 1998.

He worked for the next five years teaching and supporting various Microsoft operating systems and office products. He graduated from Spokane Community College with AA degrees in Biomedical Equipment and Wireless networking. He is currently self-employed as an information technology consultant.

Dave and his wife, Shirley, were married in 1978. She is the Widows and Wives Club Treasurer. They've been in Spokane since the ice storm in 1996. They have two daughters, Gayle and Jessica. MOAA National Life Dues vis a vis Chapter Auxiliary Membership
