Deaf in One Ear and Can't Hear Out of the Other? Dr. Christa Copus, Spokane VAMC Audiologist Speaker at 17 October Social—Airport Ramada Inn



We're going to have a very special speaker at the Sunday, 17 October social, someone who could improve your life by light years and save you thousands of dollars. Dr. Christa Copus is a highly qualified Audiologist at the Spokane VA Mann-Grandstaff Medical Center.

She's provided some remarkable things for one of our members who is totally deaf in his right ear and makes his living at sea:

- Hearing aid that transmits what he would hear in his right hear to his left ear via Bluetooth
- Pendant which hangs around his neck and receives signals from the radar on his boat if it alerts, then transmits the alarm via Bluetooth to his hearing aids.

This information should persuade you to fill out the reservation coupon right now and send it in. She will provide valuable information about hearing aids and other hearing devices that are available to veterans through the VA.

She will bring samples of various devices and will also explain how she can <u>lessen the effects of tinnitus</u>. One device is a very small microphone that can be set on a podium while someone is giving a speech, and it will transmit to an individual's hearing aids.

The health care benefit is a commitment our nation makes to service members and their families, military retirees and survivors for their years of service. Any reform of TRICARE must take into account the decades of service that constitute a prepaid, in-kind premium worthy of a top-tier health benefit. Over 80 percent of those in Congress have not served in uniform and likely do not understand the toll that service has on individuals and military families.

What can we do? Personal stories from constituents have a lot of impact on Capitol Hill. MOAA's members, councils and chapters are a great source of grassroots support. Remind congressional legislators that any TRICARE reform must take into account that military members prepaid their health benefits through decades of service and sacrifice.

Idaho Members: Please Call or Write Senator Crapo and Senator Risch ASAP



The proposed federal VA budget has been approved in the House and is expected to be voted on by the Senate in October. It includes a six-fold increase in funding for veterans homes. As a result, construction of the proposed veterans home in Post Falls could move up dramatically. Legislative addresses are to the right.

Dear Senator Crapo/Risch:

I MOST STRONGLY encourage you to support the upcoming VA Budget to dramatically increase funding for Veterans Home programs. We have a great need in north Idaho for a veterans home. As you know, 7.3 acres of shovel ready land in Post Falls has been donated by the Jacklin family for this purpose.

We have a large veteran population here and strong community support. We are ready to go as soon as the VA gives us the nod.

I ask you to use every ounce of energy and every contact you've got to make a new veterans home in Post Falls happen NOW.



Donations to Spokane Chapter, MOAA

Chapter expenses vs. revenue were reviewed at the September board meeting. Major expenses include the newsletter and website. Declining chapter assets will be a significant problem in a few years if unaddressed. The most obvious solution is to raise dues. However, the board is reluctant to do that since it would probably cause some members to not renew their membership.

Another solution is for members to make donations to the chapter. These would be tax deductible, since the chapter is a 501(c)(19). However, if would NOT be possible to make donations from an IRA Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) because the recipient must be a 501(c)3 entity.

What's in it for you? If you choose to make a donation to the chapter, 1) It could be a tax deduction if you itemize your taxes, and 2) You help maintain the chapter and avoid raising dues.
