# Response to Membership Survey

The Board of the Spokane Chapter of MOAA sent a survey to all Chapter members by email and/or by US mail on the  $5^{th}$  of January. The Board asked for your opinions or suggestions in several areas. This report will summarize the information that was collected from your answers.

Question number 1 asked for your opinion on the best time for our socials. Almost all who answered this question did not recommend any change in time or day. Two reflected individual needs that would have required a meeting on Saturday. Question number 2 asked if any persons might wish to serve on the Board. Three responded favorably. Five asked for more information on the Wives and Widows group. During Board meetings and socials those present are asked to sign appropriate letters to members of Congress that are important to the military community. Not everyone can attend socials and so 12 asked that they be included in emails. Several asked for recruiting packets and some volunteered to speak at schools. Six who replied are willing to serve as mentors. Eighteen pledged to support the high school ROTC scholarship program.

The oldest to reply was 93 years of age. Several of those who are unable to attend meetings because of age and infirmities expressed pride in our Chapter. They indicated how important the newsletter is to them. Many complemented the work of the Board.

The Board wishes to express its appreciation to those who completed the survey. It is important that we know how our members feel about the Chapter. If you still have not completed the survey, please mail it or complete the email form.



# Military Documents from National Personnel Records Center (NPRC)

Address: National Personnel Records Center, 1 Archives Drive, St. Louis MO 63138-1002

Ensure that your family knows the location of your military Separation Document—DD Form 214 from 1950 to present, and WD Form 53-55 and other variations prior to 1950. Registering a copy at the county court house may make it a public document. DD 214's issued after 1969 may contain a Social Security Number which could be used for identity theft. Storing the Separation Document in a safe deposit box may make it difficult to retrieve immediately upon the death of the veteran. The better storage locations are:

- Fire safe in a secure location of the house (not the bedroom, as this is where most thieves look first).
- 2. In a watertight food container (Glad, Tupperware, etc.) in the refrigerator, which is fire resistant and can also be easily located.

  NPRC provides copies of documents from military personnel records to authorized requestors. Fastest way: submit a request via Internet Explorer at http://www.archives.gov/veterans/military-service-records/standard-form-180.html. # Chaplain Jeff Neuberger, LtCol, CHC, USAF (Ret.) Speaker for 18 March Social at Northern Quest Casino



You won't want to miss this one! One of our newest chapter members, Jeff Neuberger, is going to tell us about his time in Iraq as an Air Force chaplain. He concluded his 34-year military career while serving as the Wing Chaplain of the 92nd Air Refueling Wing at Fairchild AFB, and prior to that his deployments included Marseilles, France; Doha, Qatar; and Balad Air Base, Iraq. His other assignments included California, Spain, North Dakota, Delaware, Germany, Georgia and Washington. He initially began his military service with the Navy in VF-33 at Oceana, Virginia, during which time he participated in three Mediterranean cruises about the carrier USS Independence. He later

served in the National Guard and then was commissioned as an Air Force chaplain. Since retiring, he has served in a number of capacities for the Episcopal Diocese of Spokane and is also a volunteer photographer for the Inland Northwest Honor Flight. Chaplain Neuberger and his wife Kathryn have two daughters and a son.

## **WIDOWS & WIVES CLUB**

Let me open by saying Happy New Year, in as much as this is the first chapter newsletter for 2012. Please note that we have had one small change in our 2012 Calendar. June 5<sup>th</sup> we are going to Christ Kitchen for luncheon. We had such a fun time there in 2010, and we were getting no response from Europa, so we felt it would be best to change.

In December we filled Christmas bags for Veterans at the Spokane Veterans Home with a mug, puzzle books, Kleenex pack, gum, candy and nuts, and Chap Stick. We also delivered 33 cards, 5 wreaths, other decorations and one small lighted tree. For the homeless veterans in Colville we gave 32 packs of Kleenex, 24 pair of socks, candy, nuts, cookies, and 70 pairs of toe warmers. We also sent five \$15 Walmart gift cards.

During 2011 we donated \$120 cash, 379 pounds of food and 56 pounds of clothing to Spokane Valley Partners. We sent 83 cards to our deployed troops. We also paid for fourteen wreaths for the Washington State Veterans Cemetery.



Our luncheon on February 7th was one of our best business meetings. We have set our volunteer programs for the year:

The Cell Phones for Soldiers program has concluded and we did pretty well. Of the 86 chapters that participated we came in Fifth Place. We shipped 1,277 for a total 76,620 minutes in calling cards. Beth Ann collected the most phones 938, Marilyn Hunt followed with 139. About 700 phones were collected from the Cricket Store on Sprague at Evergreen. He will continue to collect and ship the phones himself.

The club dues are \$10 a year, which is in addition to the chapter dues. If you would like to join our club, we are the surviving spouses and spouses of Military Officers. Through January 2012 the Washington State Veterans Cemetery had 912 veterans, spouses and dependent children interred. This past

December, through the **Wreaths Across** America program, people paid for 316 wreaths to be placed at the headstones of our fallen heroes. As you can imagine, not all the headstones were lucky enough to get a wreath. If you would like to help out for only \$15 for each wreath, you can go to our web site, www.spokanemoaa.org, and find the order form. Print it out and mail a check to Wreaths Across America.

There is a program for veterans who have gotten in a little trouble with the law and a Spokane **Veterans Court** has been set up to help these folks get back on track. Court is held on the third Thursday of each month with staffing held right after lunch and hearings starting at 2:30. The same day in the evening Spokane Veterans Forum is held. At 5 PM time is set aside for Community Resources, at 5:30 dinner is served and at 6 PM classes are held. There are mentors who are assigned to a veteran. Would you be interested in:



# SAVE 5% on YOUR GAS BILL & THE "GIVE ME TEN" RULES FOR 2012 By Marilyn Hunt



Because you belong to MOAA, you can join the Pentagon Federal Credit Union and get their Visa Platinum Rewards card that gives a 5% reduction in what you charge for gas at the pump. That's about 15 cents per gallon. The savings will be reflected in the monthly statement. You and all new Give Me Ten members can get one of these cards. Just go to www.moaa.org, click on Member Services, Finance, Pen Fed, Visa Platinum Cash Rewards, and go from there.

The 2012 Give Me Ten rules are listed below. You can get the GMT membership application forms at our socials or by contacting me at (208) 773-1074 or cinc@frontier.com. Or, if you're energetic, go to www.moaa.org/givemeten and click on Recruiting Materials.

Free: Active duty, Guard & Reserve - 1 year of free membership in MOAA national.

**Paid**: Former/retired officers and lapsed members of MOAA - 2 years of membership in MOAA national for \$30 instead of \$65. **Chapter Discount**: \$10 discount on our chapter dues to anyone who joins MOAA under Give Me Ten. (Free or Paid).

**Bottom line**: Regular members \$5 or \$30, and Auxiliary one year free or three for \$15. (Normally, dues for Regular members are \$15/1 yr. or \$40/3 years, and Auxiliary are \$9/1 yr. or \$25/3 years). Note: An officer can join MOAA without joining the chapter.
